

Fuller AK-47 Rifle Review:

Here's how the rifle build started some 3 months ago.

I regularly attend Tactical Response Classes in Camden, TN. I started with Pistol Classes, and have progressed to other areas of training. Last year at Alumni Weekend I was introduced to Sherman, one of the Tactical Response Instructors. Anyway he is a true believer in the fine attributes of the AK-47 rifle and allowed me to shoot his.

After reading the reviews of other shooters of Jim Fuller's AK-47 builds on the Tactical Responses Forum, I called Jim to talk about a rifle of my own. He told me where to get the parts kit and receiver and any extras that I wanted to have on the rifle.

So here's the components I sent Jim to build my rifle with:

1. Romanian AK-47 Kit with a G2 Trigger(single Hook)
2. Nodak Spud NDS-1 Receiver
3. ACE Non-folding Skeleton Stock
4. SAW Pistol grip
5. Phantom Flash Hider
6. Ultimak Optic Mount
7. Kalashnikov Tr-Rail Lower hand guard
8. XS Stripe Front Post

The rear site was stock, but Jim modified it to his own design, to make it work great with 24/7 front sight.

The rifle was delivered to me on time, to attend the "Fighting Rifle" class in Camden TN on 1-2 March of this year. I had one day before I went to Camden to zero the rifle; Jim said that it would hit paper at 25 yards. It did, and was only off target by 1/2" left and 1/2" low. Loaded the truck with 3000 rounds of Wolf ammo, my rifle and other gear and off to Camden.

Two days of hard shooting produced one malfunction, and I can't blame the rifle. It was a stove pipe caused by the fender of a car (too close to cover). The fender interfered with the action.

The rifle was real world accurate. At 150 yards on a steel target during movement drills, I regularly fired 3 to 5 mags from kneeling and prone



position and hit the target with boring regularity. My rifle was regularly in the mud and dirt the whole weekend and most of the time HOT!!

I have complete confidence in this rifle and am planning to have another one built as soon as I can make up my mind. It's either going to be a 16" barrel folding stock AK or a Krikov 10" barrel rifle with ATF stamp, of course.

The main thing that impressed me, besides the rifle itself, was the customer service. I can't be more pleased with the way Jim worked with me to get the rifle I wanted, and delivered on time to use in Camden.

So in closing, the only thing I'm worried about, is that when enough Fuller built rifles get out there, It will take an act of congress to get my next one built!!
